Gherardo Minicucci (Florence, 1988) is a fixed-term researcher in Criminal Law at the Department of Legal Sciences of the University of Udine.

He graduated at the University of Florence, where he obtained the PhD in legal sciences in April 2017 (curriculum in Criminal Disciplines: Criminal Law and Procedure), defending a thesis subsequently awarded in the eleventh edition of the “Doctoral Thesis Award” of the Firenze University Press (2017).

He has been a post-doc fellow (2018-2019) and research fellow in Criminal Law (2019-2020, 2021-2022) at the University of Florence, participating in several projects within the University and giving lectures, seminars and exercises. In particular, he was the winner of the *2020 Call for Young Leading Researchers* at the University of Florence. He has been repeatedly assigned in the teaching modules of Criminal Law I (2019/2020, 2020/2021) and Criminal Law II (2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021, 2021/2022) within the Course in Legal Sciences for Security of the University of Florence, as well as *tutor* in the two Criminal Law courses (1st and 2nd year) held at the School of Specialization for the Legal Professions of the University of Florence (2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021, 2021/2022).

He is a member of the editorial board of the scientific journal *Criminalia* (band A - ANVUR) and editorial coordinator of the scientific journal *disCrimen* (<https://discrimen.it>).

He is the author of a monograph (*Il dolo nella bancarotta*, Firenze University Press, Firenze, 2018, 1-312) and several minor publications.
