

Language Requirements for Admission to courses taught in Italian

To access first-cycle, second-cycle, or single-cycle master's degree courses taught in Italian, all international students are required to provide Italian language proficiency certification of at least a minimum B2 level or equivalent.

International Italian language certificates issued within the [CLIQ \(Certificazione Lingua Italiana di Qualità\) quality system](#) are accepted. These certificates are issued by the current certifying institutions:

1. University for Foreigners of Perugia – CELI
2. University for Foreigners of Siena – CILS
3. Roma Tre University – CERTIT
4. Società Dante Alighieri – PLIDA

Italian Language Proficiency Test

In case a student does not have any of the above mentioned certificates, he/she must take an Italian language proficiency test. The Italian language proficiency test for admission to the 2026/2027 academic year at the University of Udine takes place in person:

- on **Thursday September 10th of 2026** at 9:00 AM (written test) in Room A022 and at 2:00 PM (oral test) in Room No. A024, in the building located at the following address: Via delle Scienze No. 206, Udine.
- on **Friday October 9th of 2026** at 9:00 AM (written test) in Room A022 and at 2:00 PM (oral test) in Room No. A024, in the building located at the following address: Via delle Scienze No. 206, Udine.

To enrol for the test, applicants are required to send an e-mail to studenti@uniud.it by stating the name of the relevant degree course at the University of Udine they are planning to study and by attaching a copy of a valid passport no later than:

- **Friday August 28th of 2026** for the Italian language proficiency test on Thursday September 10th of 2026;
- **Friday September 25th of 2026** for the Italian language proficiency test on Friday October 9th of 2026.

Students registered for the Italian language proficiency test, organized by the University of Udine, are going to receive an email with instructions on how to take the test.

Language Requirements for Admission to courses taught in English

To access to degree courses taught entirely in English, a B2-level English language proficiency certification or an equivalent is required. For the Master's degree courses in Management Engineering, the required English proficiency level is B1 or equivalent.

Language Requirements for nationally regulated degree courses with limited enrolment

For nationally regulated with limited access degree courses, the language certification is not decisive for enrolment.

International students who pass the admission test for their chosen nationally regulated degree course but do not hold the required language certification will be allowed to obtain certification of the minimum required level of Italian language proficiency by the 30th of September of the following academic year.

New: Online Italian Language Summer Course (B2 Level)

The Language Centre (CLA) of UNIUD offers an intensive ONLINE Italian language course for prospective international students interested in enrolling at the University of Udine for the academic year 2026/2027, who need to improve their Italian language skills at B2 level.

To enrol in the course, candidates are required to assess their language level by taking an online placement test **until the 7th of June 2026**.

To enrol for the course, candidates are requested to send an email to studenti@uniud.it no later than **17th of May 2026**, by stating the name of the relevant degree course at the University of Udine they are planning to study and by attaching a copy of a valid passport.

At the end of the course, participants **will receive a certificate of frequency**, but not an international Italian language certification (such as CELI, CILS, or PLIDA).
