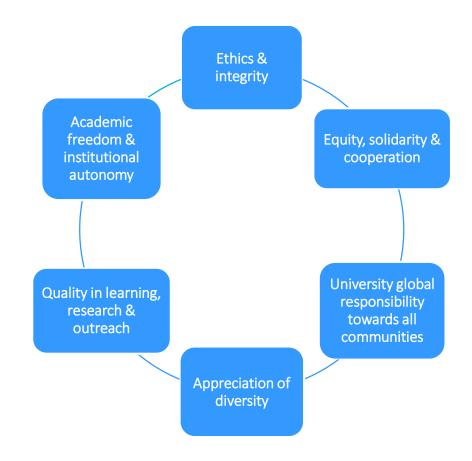

Contextual Forces Driving Change in Higher Education

- ✓ Knowledge is at the center of economic development
- ✓ Growth and economic development are main paths to success
- ✓ Globalization brings unprecedented levels of interconnectedness in all spheres of life
- ✓ More multipolarity and greater regionalization is leading to increased competitiveness
- ✓ Growing recognition of **unsustainability** of current higher education models promoting economic growth





Contextual Forces Driving Change in Higher Education (cont.)

- ✓ Inequalities both among and within nations bring unforeseen consequences such as populism, protectionary policies and new alliances
- ✓ Significant demographic trends impacting both North and South
- ✓ Continuous and rapid innovation in technology effecting higher education delivery and format
- ✓ Higher level of insecurity due to greater geopolitical tensions between and within nations
- ✓ Increased volatility, complexity and unpredictability as we approach change in higher education





Higher Education Agenda Going Forward

Higher Education Institutions are expected to:

- ✓ demonstrate quality and relevance
- ✓ contribute to national competitiveness, ensure individual employability
- ✓ advance knowledge and solve local and global challenges, real world problems.
- ✓ offer access to quality and affordable HE and ensure success of all learners
- ✓ be innovative, engage in research, knowledge transfer, enhance entrepreneurialism, link with community and industry
- ✓ anticipate and offer unbiased critique of current developments
- ✓ demonstrate social responsibility, locally and globally
- ✓ prepare graduates to be world ready, culturally sensitive and discerning

Do all of this with less and less financial support from the public purse





Global Trends in Higher Education

- 1. Expansion and growth primarily in emerging economies
- 2. Increased focus on quality and accreditation
- 3. Paradigmatic shift from teaching to learning and learning outcomes
- 4. Priority given to employability with an overwhelming focus on STEM
- 5. Local and global competition for excellence, defined by international rankings and pursuit of World Class status
- 6. Increasing share of private funding in higher education including private funding of public higher education, private-for-profit and cross border providers
- 7. Growth of online and distance education alongside traditional higher education


