Language of Instruction

The Language Centre provides Greek Language courses annually, for all language levels, designed to offer adequate linguistic support to incoming students as well as staff interested to attend them. Courses are free of charge. Apart from Greek, incoming participants can attend English, French, Spanish and German language courses.

Greek is the official language of instruction. Incoming students are encouraged to attend the Greek Language courses offered by the Language School of the University during the semesters.

Incoming students are also expected to have knowledge of the English language up to level B1 at least. They should include in their application documents official language examination certificates such as TOEFL, IGCSE or other similar. In case these are not available the students must present a certificate from their home university which verifies their knowledge of English Language up to level B1 and at the same time indicate the courses and level of English attended on their Transcript of Records. It is up to the host department to decide whether this certificate is considered enough for the student's acceptance. Currently the Department of Communication and Internet Studies offers an English semester of 30 ECTS during the spring semester. Other CUT Departments may offer bibliography, assignments, tutorials and exams in English for certain courses that are pre-agreed with the academics in the relevant departments.

Courses

All courses taught at CUT are described in the official Language of the University, Greek. Course information can be also found in the web page of each department independently. A Course catalogue in English is updated on the website regularly so as to allow incoming participants to make well informed choices prior to mobility.

- Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to <u>iss@uniud.it</u>). **I UDINEO1** cannot guarantee the acceptance of another modality to nominate Erasmus students by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc...).
- I UDINEO1 will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the reception of the nomination letter.
- Erasmus incoming student at **I UDINEO1** has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by I UDINEO1 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.

Termination or modification of the agreement:

A unilateral decision to discontinue or to change the exchanges notified to the other party by September 20/../ will only take effect from the October of the following new academic year.

Cyprus University of Technology (CY LIMASSO02)

The receiving institution will send its decision within six weeks.

A **Transcript of Records** will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [5] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]

Termination of the agreement

The inter-institutional agreement may be amended by mutual agreement. The inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by either party. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. In the event of such notice being given, all existing commitments to staff or students will be fulfilled. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

Calculation of Semester Grade Point Average (GPA)

For each course, the number of credits is multiplied by the numerical value of the ordinal grade received to obtain the Grade Points:
(Number of ECTS) X (Numerical (European) Value of the Ordinal Grade) = Grade Points

Then, calculate the semester grade point average by dividing the sum of grade points • by the sum of the semester credits:(Sum of Grade Points) / (Sum of Semester Credits) = Semester Grade Point Average

2.Visa

Non – European Union (non E.U.) students should contact the University of Cyprus to inquire whether they need to apply for a visa. Should a visa be required, students may apply to the Cyprus Embassy or Consulate in their country of origin. Visa Requirements for citizens from countries that there is a Cyprus Embassy or Consulate Those students will obtain their visa from the Cyprus Embassy or Consulate in their country. However, to be able to do so they are required first to submit at Cyprus University of Technology the following documents (two copies each). It is to be noted that the Cyprus Civil Registry and Migration Department, will forward the documents of each individual at the Cyprus Embassy or Consulate in their country: Certified copy of a valid passport or other travel document to cover: At least two years, Duly certified copies of academic qualifications. Duly certified copy of good conduct letter from the police authorities in their country with an official translation into English or Greek. This letter is considered valid for a six month period. Duly certified copies of medical certificates attesting to good
	 health, and including blood tests (hepatitis B, C, HIV and syphilis) and Chest X-Ray (Tuberculosis). Medical examinations are considered valid for a four-month period. Acceptance letter from Cyprus University of Technology, with full description of his/her program and its duration. Documentary proof from a bank in their country that first-semester tuition fees have been transferred through Western Union/ Money Gram or by swift transfer (this is not required when the foreigner is granted a full scholarship). Documentary proof from a bank in their country that the student can afford to pay his/her living expenses in Cyprus and tuition fees or documentary proof for granting a scholarship from an institution in their country. Students must present in cash or travel checks the amount of \$2.600 or €2.000 for their living expenses (full scholarship students are excluded). 4 passport size photographs. €85,43 visa fees.

The Cypriot Embassy or Consulate in their country will contact the individuals and invite them for an interview. At the time of the interview they need to present the original documents of ail the above. If the entry visa is granted to the individual, the Consulate will stamp his/her documents and will return them back to him/her. The students who are successful in obtaining a Visa they have to present the stamped documents as they were presented during the interview at the Embassy/Consulate, at the point of

3. Insurance

At the University of Udine: Non Eu students can provide personally to get a private insurance in order to obtain the VISA for the study period.

Eu students can ask to the home authorities for the European Health Insurance ("TEAM") for the full Erasmus study period.

The Student General Accident Insurance Scheme mentioned at http://www.cut.ac.cy/erasmus/data/ which costs 7€, will be covered on behalf of the Erasmus Office for each incoming student. Please keep in mind that the start period of the Student General Accident Insurance Scheme starts mid October for all (local or international Students) and is valid until the end of academic year (May end).

Students are expected to use their own Health and Safety Plan prior or after the above mentioned period. A visit to Hospital/ Clinic for medical reasons is only free to Governmental Hospitals in the event that students present their European Blue card (or health card).

E.U. students, who have the European Medical Card E111, are entitled to free medical care by Cyprus national hospitals, upon presentation of the card.

Non - E.U. students, as well as E.U. students not in possession of the above card, must obtain private medical insurance for in-hospital and outpatient medical treatment in Cyprus

All students must have medical insurance in their country. Any further document required by a Company during a placement regarding liability, must be arranged on the part of the Incoming Student.

4. Housing

The receiving institution will guide incoming mobile participants in finding accommodation, according to the requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education.
