- **I UDINE01** will send a detailed Erasmus nomination list <u>by e-mail</u>. I UDINE01 cannot guarantee any other nomination modality.
- Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to <u>iss@uniud.it</u>). **I UDINE01** cannot guarantee the acceptance of any other nomination modality by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc...).
- **I UDINE01** will send the letter of acceptance and information package within 8 weeks from reception of the nomination letter.
- A SPITTAL01 will send its decision within six weeks after the application deadline
- Erasmus incoming students at **I UDINE01** have to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine. Should they fail to do so, the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent directly to the students' personal address by I UDINE01 within 5 weeks.
- A Transcript of Records will be issued by **A SPITTAL01** ideally six weeks after the assessment period and no later than 4 weeks after the semester ended.

Termination or modification of the agreement:

A unilateral decision to discontinue or to change the exchanges notified to the other party by September 20/../ will only take effect from 1st October of the following new academic year.
