- Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to iss@unlud.it). I UDINEO1 cannot guarantee the acceptance of another modality to nominate Erasmus students by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc...).
- I UDINEO1 will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the reception of the nomination letter.
- Erasmus incoming student at I UDINEO1 has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by I UDINEO1 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.

A GRAZO1: will send its decision after receiving the nomination by the partner university within 6 weeks

A GRAZO1: a Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the University of Graz.

Students can print off their transcript through their UNIGRAZonline account. These transcripts are automatically generated and, thus, do not bear signature nor stamp.

Transcripts printed on official University's paper, signed and stamped by the director of studies will only be issued upon email request. Please note that transcripts are issued by our Academic Affairs Office. Thus, the International Office can only request the transcript ONCE and only send it once after receiving it from the Academic Affairs Office.

Termination or modification of the agreement:
