- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within six weeks.
- 2. I UDINE01 will send a detailed Erasmus nomination list <u>by e-mail</u>. It cannot be guaranteed another modality to nominate Erasmus students from I UDINE01.
- 3. Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to iss@uniud.it). I UDINE01 cannot guarantee the acceptance of another modality to nominate Erasmus students by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc...).
- 4. I UDINE01 will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the reception of the nomination letter.
- 5. Erasmus incoming student at I UDINE01 has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by I UDINE01 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.
- 6. Termination or modification of the agreement:
 A unilateral decision to discontinue or to change the exchanges notified to the other party by September 20/../ will only take effect from the October of the following new academic year.

- 4. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than five weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 5. Termination of the agreement: In whichever case, either party can terminate the Agreement by informing the other party expressly in writing with at least one year's notice. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September

University of Granada grading system

In the Spanish university system, each course unit is graded on a scale from 0 to 10 points, and each numerical grade corresponds to a qualitative grade as follows: Suspenso (Fail): 0- 4.9 - Aprobado (Pass): 5- 6.9 - Notable (Good): 7- 8.9 - Sobresaliente (Very Good): 9- 10 - Matricula de Honor: A special mention for outstanding performance limited to a maximum of 5% of students registered in a given course unit group. When a student does not take the corresponding examination or final assessment, this is reflected as No Presentado (Absent). To pass a course unit, a student must receive a grade of at least 5 points out of 10.
