- 1. The I UDINE01 will send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by <u>e-mail</u>. It cannot be guaranteed another modality to nominate Erasmus students from I UDINE01 (such as online nominations etc.).
- 2. Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to iss@uniud.it). It cannot be guaranteed the acceptance of another modality to nominate Erasmus students by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc.).
- 3. The I UDINE01 will send its decision (information package) within 8 weeks at the maximum from the reception of the nomination letter.
- 4. Erasmus incoming student at the I UDINE01 has to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine, otherwise the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent by the I UDINE01 no later than 5 weeks directly to the personal post address of the student.
- The receiving institution will send its decision within 6/8 weeks.
- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement: If the agreement is signed for more than one academic year, the partners commit to amend the agreement in case of changes in the mobility data by no later than the end of January in the preceding academic year.

Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

F. Information

1. Grading systems of the institutions

F GRENOBL01

The academic year is on a semester basis with each semester worth 30 ECTS as defined in the Bologna agreement of the European Higher Education System.

Grades are on a scale from 0 to 20 where 10/20 is the average passing grade.

However, in the French academic system, grades are viewed as a whole set for a semester which means that it is not only the individual grade in a given class that must be considered but the set of grades for a semester.

At the Bachelor's level, the average of all classes in a semester must be greater than or equal to 10/20.

At the Master's level, the overall average for all classes in a semester must be greater than or equal to 10/20 **AND** all individual class grades must be greater than or equal to 7/20. For Engineering degrees the average is actually 7/20 instead of 10/20.

In addition, grades in a class are a combination of knowledge based grades and competencies. Hence it is not strictly the rule that is to be learned but the concept behind it must be understood as well.

The following grading table reflects the way grades are given at UJF for a semester. Although very high grades are seldom given for classwork, grades for practicals, labs and internship rarely go below 10/20.

Grade/20 for a semester based on rule above	European Grading System
18-20	Very uncommon (approx. 1 out of 1000 students). Brilliant and exceptional results
16-18	Outstanding performance, first-rate results
14-16	Very good to excellent results.
12-14	Good to very good results
10-12	Passing to satisfactory results
10	Lowest passing grade: standard has been met but with a number of notable errors
< 10	Fail, further work required

Hence a student with a grade above 12/20 is considered to be a good student while a student with 14/20 or above is a VERY good student.
