Note for mobility that starts at Leipzig University: The duration of stay may vary from the number of days for which the participant will receive financial support. As a rule at Leipzig University the maximum number of days financially supported through the Erasmus+ scheme will be 12 working days plus 1 additional subsequent or precedent day for traveling. Any time exceeding 13 days will be granted up to a maximum of 60 days but will be categorized as zero grant time with no Erasmus+ financial support.

 - Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to iss@uniud.it). I UDINE01 cannot guarantee the acceptance of any other nomination modality by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc...).
 - **I UDINE01** will send the letter of acceptance and information package within 8 weeks from reception of the nomination letter.
- As receiving institution D LEIPZIG01 will make all efforts to send its decision within 6 weeks
- Erasmus incoming students at I UDINEO1 have to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine. Should they fail to do so, the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent directly to the students' personal address by I UDINEO1 within 5 weeks.
- As receiving institution D LEIPZIG01 will make efforts to issue a Transcript of Records no later than 8 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- · Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a written notice of at least one academic year has to be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
