- Partner Universities have to send a detailed Erasmus nomination list by e-mail (to <u>iss@uniud.it</u>). **I UDINE01** cannot guarantee the acceptance of any other nomination modality by partner Universities (such as online nominations etc...).
- **I UDINE01** will send the letter of acceptance and information package within 8 weeks from reception of the nomination letter.
- Erasmus incoming students at **I UDINE01** have to collect the Transcript of Records before leaving Udine. Should they fail to do so, the Transcript of Records will be issued and sent directly to the students' personal address by I UDINE01 within 5 weeks.
- AINNSBRU01: The University of Innsbruck will send its decision after receipt of the complete application. The Admission Department will send the Letter of Acceptance in August and January.
- 3. **AINNSBRU01:** Each student can print the Transcript of Records personally. A signed and stamped version is issued by the International Relations Office on demand.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

A notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

Termination or modification of the agreement:

A unilateral decision to discontinue or to change the exchanges notified to the other party by September 20/../ will only take effect from 1st October of the following new academic year.
